The »GRAND CLASSIC LADIES« comes in three attractive versions – but they all share the same quality features: ETA 2836-2 precision movement with day/date, polished stainless steel case, convex sapphire crystal, sapphire crystal case back, water resistant to 10 bar, leather strap with polished stainless steel screws and polished stainless steel clasp. With a diameter of just 36.4 mm, they are 6.6 mm smaller than the Grand Classic men's watches.

The white version (ref. no. 610-01) of the new Grand Classic Ladies has a striking mother-of-pearl dial.

The ladies' Grand Classic (ref. no. 610-05) is also available in brown, like the men's models.

Some might say that this move was long overdue. We would say, however, that there is a time for everything. As a company which not only looks back on a long tradition, but is determined to uphold that tradition, we never lose sight of our heritage. Ever since we first began to develop top-class watches in the Saxon town of Glashütte back in 1927, the name Tutima has been a byword for reliability and functional design.

The new Grand Classic Ladies again lives up to that claim. It is no exaggeration to say that the feminine version of the Grand Classic, which was launched to celebrate Tutima's 80th anniversary, is unique: on the one hand, it matches the toughness, precision and characteristic aviation chronograph design of the men's models; on the other hand, it comes with its own exceptionally feminine flair, not only because of its smaller 36.4-mm diameter. It is this unusual combination that makes the Grand Classic Ladies so absolutely unique.

Its ability to work reliably at water pressure of 10 bar alone distinguishes the Grand Classic Ladies from conventional ladies' watches, even in the high-end segment. But this watch can do even more.

As you would expect of a Tutima, the new ladies' series offers an impeccably tuned combination of quality, functionality and design. Quality features include the Swiss-made ETA 2836-2 precision movement, polished stainless steel case, convex, scratch resistant sapphire crystal and the distinctive sapphire case back. And, just like our pilots' watches, not only the time, but also the day and date can be read at a glance. Stylish but unpretentious details, such as leather strap with polished stainless steel screws and polished stainless steel clasp, or the mother-of-pearl dial in the white version, add the perfect finishing touch to these aviation chronographs.

Although this may all sound fine on paper, anyone who examines the real thing will confirm that we can justly claim without false modesty, with the Grand Classic Ladies, our designers and watchmakers have succeeded in achieving that rare feat: the creation of a new product which is instantly hailed as a classic.

In addition to the new Grand Classic Ladies series, Baselworld 2010 also saw the launch of yet another innovation from Tutima: the Pacific Automatic with 43 mm diameter. This new instrument watch in the Tutima Military line also comes in a choice of three different versions, including one with a dial made of carbon, an extremely light and tough composite. What they all have in common is their timelessly elegant design and unconditional observance of a strict principle: functionality takes top priority.

And so the Pacific Automatic continues the successful series of timepieces in our Military line, such as the wristwatch used by the German air force pilots, which has already proved its dependability the world over as the official NATO watch. Like the Tutima Pacific 300, the new model is a maritime version of that reliable aviation chronograph.

The Pacific Automatic has therefore been designed to cope with even the toughest demands in hurricane conditions at sea: with 60-minute diving scale and water resistant to 20 bar, it satisfies even the most stringent standards in terms of quality and resilience. Its practical stainless steel case houses a reliable self-winding ETA 2836-2 movement with day and date.

The scratch resistant sapphire crystal with antireflective coating reveals a clearly arranged dial. Superluminova coating on hands and numerals ensures good readability even in the dark. The sturdy safety clasp guarantees that the solid stainless steel bracelet will never open accidentally. And finally, the integrated overall extension is an apparently minor but practical detail. All in all, this is undeniably a new masterpiece from Tutima.



## BLACK STEEL TWO NEW »GRAND CLASSIC« MODELS

Deepest black and even tougher than our toughest favorites: the cases and bracelets of the two new watches in the »Grand Classic« series are made of hardened stainless steel and coated with scratch resistant black PVD, giving the »Grand Classic Black Chronograph« and the »Grand Classic Black« a really distinctive flair.

A high-tech process results in extreme hardness, not only of the case and bracelet surfaces, but also in the deeper layers of the material. The outer PVD (physical vapor deposition) coating alone has the amazing hardness rating of approx. 2000 Vickers, which is roughly equivalent to sapphire. If this coating were applied to steel of ordinary hardness, there would be a risk that it would indent the metal under pressure. Accordingly, the steel first undergoes special treatment to make it extra hard – a process which ensures that both »Grand Classic Black Chronograph« and »Grand Classic Black« will remain permanently and immaculately black.

# TOP TROPHIES FOR YACHTING ACES

With around 3 million spectators from more than 70 countries, 4500 competitors and 1750 yachts, this summer's Kieler Woche regattas were again a superlative sailing event. Tutima has been the official timekeeper here at the world's largest sailing regattas since 2004. This summer, we increased our commitment even further. Moreover, the company also played a central role at the »Robbe & Berking Classic Week 2010«.

Once again, the Tutima yacht ([www.tutima-yacht.de](http://www.tutima-yacht.de)) was in the line-up at the start of Kieler Woche. Skipper Kirsten Harmstorf's team, already successful in World and European Championships, again secured one of the top places, thanks to the contestants' skills and the first-class equipment – which, of course, also included the reliable chronographs that were designed specially to cope with the demands of yachting.

This year's Kieler Woche included the first contest for the »Tutima German ORC Trophy«, which consists of several IDM offshore and inshore races. Uwe Wenzel from Bremen was repeatedly out in front in both sections and consequently won the overall event, earning him a very special prize from our company: a Tutima Pacific 300.

With its pure titanium case, this instrument watch can easily cope with even the toughest conditions, such as pressure of 30 bar. It comes with a scratch resistant sapphire crystal with antireflective coating, screw-down crown, bidirectional rotating bezel, rubber strap and overall extension, making the blue Tutima Pacific 300 the ideal choice for chasing new regatta records.
